



What is the working environment like in a MLB pressbox? These descriptions are just about what it is like in Washington and Baltimore. Other cities have different layouts.

What is the working environment like in a MLB pressbox? These descriptions are just about what it is like in Washington and Baltimore. Other cities have different layouts.

- · The pressboxes are on two levels. The lower level is for the print media (newspapers, websites). The upper level is for broadcast media (radio, television) and scoreboard operators.
- · MLB Data Operations has four people working at every game: the Official Scorer, two Stringers, and the Field Timing Coordinator.
- · The official scorer has a television and DVR at their seat to be able to view instant replays. We also have a microphone, to announce scoring decisions in the pressbox. The pressbox is very large, so the announcements are the most efficient way to get our rulings out to everybody who needs them.
- \cdot MLB provides us with a computer system to view up-to-date game statistics and several instant replay angles.



Training for a MLB Official Scorer?

Dennis and Jason took similar routes to Major League Baseball.

- · We both learned the craft in Minor League Baseball.
- · Each MLB team has four minor league affiliates where young prospects and reserve players play. We both worked as an official scorer for Frederick Keys and Bowie Baysox games. Both are (or were) minor league affiliates (farm teams) of the Baltimore Orioles.
- Not all MLB official scorers have minor league scoring experience. Everybody came to the job with some baseball-related experience.
- · There is less training at the minor league level. The major leagues provide more training and support.





Software for support


MLB has an internal software system to help the scorers and stringers. Here are things we can see:

- · Live play-by-play, pitch-by-pitch.
- · Live box score.
- · Replays from multiple camera angles, notably the television broadcast and the "high home."
- · Pitch speed, batted ball speed, launch angle.
- · Other analytics, such as spin rate, running distance by fielders.









Appeals of scoring decisions

- · MLB players can appeal scoring decisions.
- This right was negotiated, and is in the collective bargaining agreement between MLB and the MLB Players Association.
- · Appeals go to a committee at MLB, who has the final ruling.
- The Official Scoring Appeals Committee usually gives a short description of why they made their ruling.



2020 season

- · During the 2020 season, all official scorers worked from home.
- \cdot We had to rely on game broadcasts, and the extra camera angles from our internal system.
- · Game broadcasts made things a little difficult. In particular, when a batter hit a hard ground ball to third base or first base, the camera angle was often a split second too slow to see what happened.
- · Jason worked his first season as a MLB official scorer by working from home. First game, first batter... sharp ground ball to third base!!! The camera was slow to switch to what happened. Thank goodness, the third baseman fielded the ball and threw out the batter.


Scoresheets



Ordinary Effort

As we all know, the most common scoring decisions are hit vs. error decisions, with the criteria of "ordinary effort" used to make decisions.

The Official Baseball Rules gives this definition:

ORDINARY EFFORT is the effort that a fielder of average skill at a position in that league or classification of leagues should exhibit on a play, with due consideration given to the condition of the field and weather conditions.

 \rightarrow

Here are some things we have to consider when thinking about ordinary effort.

- · Field conditions: sun, rain, bad hops, bad conditions causing a fielder to slip.
- The difference between a mental mistake and a physical mistake.
- · Fielder's colliding.
- \cdot Our experience from watching a LOT of baseball and from talking to other official scorers guides us every day on the job.
